<p>Learning hint</p> <p>Dig out some family photos, the more people in them the better – wedding groups are ideal. Point to each person and say who they are using Éste/ésta es mi ... Even better, get together with someone else who's learning Spanish and ask about the people in his or her photos by pointing and saying ¿Quién es éste/ésta? Then answer that person's questions about your family.</p>
