

## **ADDITIONAL TERMS OF USE FOR BBC RSS FEEDS**

**DATE: 7 JANUARY 2011**

### **1. WHAT IS A BBC RSS FEED?**

**"BBC RSS Feed"** is a BBC Online Service provided by the BBC. It is an RSS, API or other application which is identified by the BBC as a feed that enables you, or users of a Business User's product or service, to access, view and/or listen to BBC Content.

### **2. HOW CAN I USE THE BBC RSS FEEDS?**

- 2.1. You can use a BBC RSS Feed for personal use provided you comply with the Terms of Use for personal use and these Additional Terms.
- 2.2. You can use a BBC RSS Feed for business use provided you comply with the Business Terms of Use and these Additional Terms.
- 2.3. You may use the BBC RSS Feed in order to display the BBC Content on your website, blog or other product or service.
- 2.4. You must display the BBC RSS Feeds that you subscribe to in full and accurately on your website, blog or other product or service.
- 2.5. You may not directly or indirectly change, edit, add to or produce summaries of any BBC Content or any other content available at [bbc.co.uk](http://bbc.co.uk) nor place any full-story BBC Content in an HTML frame-set.
- 2.6. You do not have the right to use any BBC Content or BBC mark/logo on your website, blog or other product or service or elsewhere except as provided in the BBC RSS Feed itself.
- 2.7. If you are a Business User you will additionally: (i) require users of your product or service to comply with equivalent terms to the Business Terms of Use for their use of BBC RSS Feeds; and (ii) adhere to the restrictions on how you can use the BBC RSS Feed in the Business Terms of Use.
